Paul sings a fair tune

Vancouver rocker Paul Hyde this week recorded a cover version of the traditional Irish tune "She Moved Through the Fair" with producer Ben Mink for the soundtrack of the Canadian-Irish feature co-production *Fifty Dead Men Walking*.

Mink is just finishing soundtrack work on the feature, which stars Jim Sturgess (*Across the Universe*) as an Irishman recruited by the British to go undercover in the IRA. The true story is based on events in the late 1980s and also stars Rose McGowan and Sir Ben Kingsley. Canadian Kari Skogland directed the feature in Ireland.

Skogland also wrote new lyrics for the song that Hyde sings. Hyde's version will play over the movie's closing scenes. Past versions of the song were done by Van Morrison and Sinead O'Connor.
